MINUTES: The meeting commenced at 19:30

1. Introduction

Andy Meek (AM) opened the meeting, welcomed all, dealt with housekeeping (fire exit and toilets), the meeting code of conduct and apologies (detailed above)

2. Minutes of AGM 6th October 2016

AM confirmed minutes were circulated after the AGM and no amendments were made.

- Morley Morgan (MMn) proposed to accept the minutes
 - o Fran Healey (FH) seconded the proposal
 - The minutes were unanimously accepted on a show of hands

3. Review Action Log

AM reviewed the outstanding actions and noted the following:

- 1. Planning applications are monitored weekly and loaded to the RMNF website. They are available for anyone to review if they wish. This action is on going.
- 2. The Neighbourhood Plan action is on going and there is a more detailed update later in the meeting. It was noted that the farming community have had little input into our forum and RMNF trustees will strive to engage with and involve the farmers.
- 3. Catley Lane Head conservation status There have been a number of objections. The Conservation Project Officer is planning to publish a simple guide to explain conservation status. The guide will be posted to objectors and it's expected the decision will be made at the Township Meeting in December.
- 4. Shawfield Turbine it was noted the turbine is currently not in its consented location, might be operating illegally and a second set of footings, presumably in the consented location, have been installed to protect the applicants planning permission. Members of the forum involved in the Neighbourhood Plan process and some representatives from affected communities have requested a meeting with planning to understand what criteria is being used to determine compliance management. The RMNF Neighbourhood Plan Group believe they require a better understanding to facilitate a meaningful plan that is helpful to council officers. Cecile Biant (CB) advised a meeting was provisionally diarised for the 16/11/17.

5. Catley Lane Head drains – It was noted that this action was still outstanding and will be carried forward as sediment washed down from the moor is an on going issue. It was also noted that the footpath on left as you enter the rural section of Rooley Moor Road traveling towards Catley Lane Head was in poor condition and requires cleaning and repair.

ACTION: CB to request a gully cleaner

ACTION: CB to request the footpath noted above to be cleaned and repaired

- Win McGhee (WM) proposed to accept the outstanding actions
 - CB seconded the proposal
 - o The outstanding actions were unanimously accepted on a show of hands

4. Accounts for year ending 31st August 2017

FH explained the accounts and recommended to increase our reserves policy to £400 to cover insurance and website costs for the coming year.

7. Propose change to our constitution required to accommodate the position of Honorary President

The wording for insertion in to our constitution is as follows:

'Honorary President

The Trustees may from time to time elect an Honorary President of the Forum to hold office for a period of three (3) years. No subscription shall be required from an honorary member and the Honorary President may stand for re-election for additional terms.

The Honorary President has no executive function and the role carries no Trustee responsibility.

The Honorary President shall be entitled to attend meetings of the forum, but not to vote.'

AM noted thanks to Roy Thorniley for his contribution to our forum and was pleased to report Roy will remain as a member of the forum. AM asked members to consider if they wished to become a trustee and let AR know if they did. CB suggested trustees vacancies should be advertised when skill gaps become apparent. All agreed the importance of Vice Chair was realised at this years event when AM wasn't able to officiate.

ACTION: AR to ask if anyone would like to take up the position of Vice Chair and (or) trustee.

There was a proposal to ask Sue Devaney to be a 'Patron' of our forum.

9. Next Steps - Neighbourhood Plan

AR gave an overview of next steps and timelines. All agreed this would become more meaningful when draft policies become available for review. Involvement of the farming community was noted as very important and the trustees present at this meeting agreed to make contact.

10. Open Forum

- Community event There were mixed feelings about holding another event. We discussed having an event:
 - o At a different place and time
 - With a different theme
 - The following year

ACTION: AR to seek event group membership to discuss this point further

- Donations to other charitable organisations that supported our August 17 event. We agreed to donate:
 - £50 to the Okenhoof clog dancers, and
 - £50 to The Met for the loan of the PA equipment (Note: FH declared an interest in The Met and did not vote)
- Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) application
 - FH advised our application for a grant to promote our 'Shared Heritage' had been successful. Fran took everyone through a high level presentation with details of the £11.9K grant, which includes partnership funding from Rochdale Council (£9.4K HLF plus £2.5K RC) and the HLF 'approved purpose'.

All agreed this is a fantastic opportunity and a number of people indicated they would like to be involved.

ACTION: FH to establish an HLF group to discuss this point further

- Traffic calming, fly tipping and illegal off road use
 - Traffic calming measures have been suggested as a better prospect than quiet lanes status. The forum has £744 of restricted funds that can be used for signage to promote road safety. HM suggested a number of different signs. AR proposed we try to set up a meeting with the council to discuss how to best spend the money for maximum effect

ACTION: AR to set up meeting

- Fly tipping advice is to report to Environmental management
- o Illegal off road use advice is to report to 101. Phil Massey (PM) said the Police informed the Spotland & Falinge Area Forum they thought the problem had improved because reporting had reduced. A number of people raised concern with the 101 process being inadequate, there was also concern about challenging off road users who could be aggressive. AR advised that since publishing the RMNF illegal off road reporting initiative in August, there had been no emails to report any issues. All agreed to reinvigorate this imitative.

ACTION: AR to re-notify the bikes@rmnf.org.uk initiative on social media

- AOB
 - AR advised our forum was supporting Norden, Slattocks and Bamford who are considering the neighbourhood forum process for their areas
 - David Ireland (DI) raised the issue of Catley Lane Head drains and his property being exposed to flooding because kerb levels had not been increased when the road was re-laid - CB advised she would review
 - WH advised that the stone wall adjacent to Rooley Moor Road and the fishing pond was collapsing. Win wanted to know who would be responsible for repairing gate wall. CB advised she would review and advise
 - Spotland & Falinge in Bloom CB & PM explained the process and suggested Catley Lane Head should consider entering next year's competition. All agreed this is a great opportunity and a number of people indicated they would like to be involved

ACTION: AR to establish an 'In Bloom' group to discuss this point further

 Christmas tree for Catley Lane Head- A number of people thought the possibility of get together for carols, mince pies and mulled wine was a great idea. WM will make enquiries about a tree for the village as will FH when she next meets wit the council

Reports from Trustees and Officers of the Forum

Structure, Governance and Management

Trustees manage the affairs of the CIO and may for that purpose exercise all the powers of the CIO. In exercising their powers and duties, charity trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charities Commission.

It is the duty of each trustee:

- To exercise his or her powers and to perform his or her functions as a trustee of the CIO in the way he or she decides in good faith would be most likely to further the purposes of the CIO; and
- b) To exercise, in the performance of those functions, such care and skill as is reasonable in the circumstances having regard in particular to:
 - i. any special knowledge or experience that he or she has or holds himself or herself out as having; and
 - ii. if he or she acts as a charity trustee of the CIO in the course of a business or profession, to any special knowledge or experience that it is reasonable to expect of a person acting in the course of that kind of business or profession.

Members of the CIO have no liability to contribute to its assets and no personal responsibility for settling its debts and liabilities.

There are no paid employees of the CIO and the value of services provided by volunteers is not incorporated into financial reporting.

Including trustees and officers there are currently 40 members of the CIO with voting rights. This remains at the same level as last year.

Recruitment & Appointment of Trustees

At every subsequent annual general meeting of the members of the CIO, one-third of the charity trustees shall retire from office. If the number of charity trustees is not three, or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to one-third shall retire from office, but if there is only one charity trustee, he or she shall retire.

Any vacancies so arising may be filled by the decision of the members at the annual general meeting and the members or the charity trustees may at any time decide to appoint a new charity trustee, whether in place of a charity trustee who has retired or been removed, or as an additional charity trustee, provided that the limit of 12 charity trustees is not exceeded.

This year Nick Green resigned as Trustee.

Cecile Biant and Morley Morgan are standing down as Trustees but wish to be considered for reelection.

Phil Massey, Steve Davison and Councillor Wendy Cox wish to be appointed as Trustees.

BIOGRAPHYS

Mr Philip Massey.

As someone who is passionate about the community of Spotland & Falinge and our Borough in general, I am volunteering to become a trustee of the Rooley Moor Neighbourhood Forum.

With the Neighbourhood plan and remarkable heritage projects that RMNF are undertaking, it's clear that the RMNF is a true gem of Spotland and Falinge ward. Above all I advocate your principles of working together to protect and enhance our neighbourhood.

I was brought up on Woodstock St in Meanwood, before moving to Hull to attend university.

My Wife and I have also lived in Oxford, Salford Quays and Todmorden, but decided to return to Rochdale, to raise our family. We have two children aged six and two years.

We have been happily distributing greeting cards for the last eleven years. Being self-employed in a Partnership I am excellent at using my own skills and initiative to complete tasks and realise projects, but also work well alongside my Wife and partner where required.

Dr Steve Davison,

I am a long standing resident of Norden with a passion for the environment, the outdoors and our wealth of local heritage. I love mountain biking on our extensive local trails and Rooley Moor Road is one of my favourite routes. I am always surprised that so many people in Rochdale haven't heard about the road or its historic significance. I started to take a more active interest in its preservation and promotion as a result of Coronation Power's planning application for a wind farm alongside the road. That was the first time that I had become actively involved with a community group and I feel very fortunate to have made many new friends along the way. More recently I helped in the campaign to fight off the extension to Scout Moor Wind Farm, leading on the technical aspects of renewable energy policy.

In terms of my background and what I can offer to the forum as a trustee I am a scientist by training with a doctorate in physics. Most of my career has been involved in IT. I developed the initial version of the forum's website and it is great to see what a valuable resource it has become as a result of the hard work of others. I don't anticipate much more work will be required to the underlying code but I am happy to help with normal maintenance activities and handling less frequent security issues. I am also very happy to help out in other areas as best I can and hope I can bring a slightly different perspective to the group based on my professional experience as a director of a number of small IT companies.

As a Councillor I am the assistant to the Cabinet Member for Health & Wellbeing and Chair of the Rochdale Township Clean and Green Priority Group. I am also a member of the Rochdale Township Committee and the Spotland and Falinge Area Forum.

My appointments to outside bodies include Greater Manchester Passenger Transport Authority Ring & Ride Steering Group, Rochdale Boroughwide Housing Board Representative Committee, Rochdale Chamber of Commerce Local Council and Rochdale Shop Mobility Executive Committee.

Being a trustee of the forum helps maintain a strong relationship with our Council.

Forum Objects

The CIO is established for the public benefit without distinction of ability, sex, sexual orientation, race or political, religious or other opinions for the following purposes in the area of benefit known as Rooley Moor, which shall hereinafter be referred to as the Neighbourhood

The objects of the CIO are:

- 1. To promote high standards of planning and architecture in or affecting the area of benefit.
- 2. To educate the public in the geography, history, natural history, culture and architecture of the area of benefit.
- 3. To secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features or areas of historic or public interest in the area of benefit.

In furtherance of the above objects but not otherwise the trustees shall have the power to establish a neighbourhood forum for the area of benefit to promote and or improve the social, economic and environmental well-being of the area.

Accounting Policy, Income & Funds Structure

Income arises from restricted funds (grants), unrestricted donations and recovered Gift Aid.

Expenditure is recognised when an invoice is received or payment made.

There are no tangible fixed assets.

The Reserves Policy of Rooley Moor Neighbourhood Forum CIO is to hold reserves from unrestricted funds to cover our known liabilities (such as insurance, hire of meeting rooms, website costs, etc.). £400 has been proposed to cover these costs. The reserves policy will be reviewed at each AGM.

Thursday 16th November, meeting with Michael Brooke (RMBC Communications Officer) to discuss our HLF project.

Friday 16th November, meeting with Paul Simpson (Planning Consultant) to discuss the Neighbourhood Plan

Friday 24th November, meeting with Andrew Crossley (Agent for the Lord of the Manor) to discuss our Neighbourhood Plan and illegal use of the moor (fly tipping, 4x4's, etc.).

Monday 27th November, Rooley Moor Neighbourhood Forum receives £9,400 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) towards a 'Shared Heritage' project.

December 2017:

Monday 4th December, meeting to discuss arrangements for Catley Carols - Great Christmas Get Together.

Wednesday 6^{th} December, Rochdale Township Committee approve conservation status for Catley Lane Head.

Monday 18th December, Catley Lane Head Christmas tree lights switched on.

Thursday 21st December, Catley Carols - Our great Christmas get together! We took a car boot full of food and a cheque for £75 to Rochdale Foodbank and they were very appreciative. All had a good night!

Friday 18th May, GDPR implemented in readiness for the 25th May 2018 deadline.

Saturday 27th May 2018, an Equestrian Rendezvous event was held in Catley Lane Head. Horse riders from Rossendale, Wardle, Bury, Bolton and Rochdale descended on Catley Lane Head on Rooley Moor Road for this year's Pennine Rendezvous.

The brainchild of The National Federation of Bridleways Associations (NFBA), this annual gettogether occurs in different areas of The Pennines and this year it was the turn of Rochdale and Bury Bridleways Association to be the hosts.

The idea of the event is to highlight the importance of bridleways and byways to horse riders as safe off-road areas to ride and to show riders routes they can use outside of their normal riding area.

This year's event was blessed with superb weather. Each participant was awarded a rosette by The Lord Lieutenant of Greater Manchester, Warren Smith. Cosima Towneley, the chair of NFBA, introduced the Lord Lieutenant and described the aims of the event.

The rosettes celebrated the 70th anniversary of The British Horse Society which was founded in 1947 and were also to mark that May is Ride Out UK Month 2018 which is all about raising awareness of off-road riding and the need to protect and restore multi-user routes across the UK.

The event raised £155 for North West Air Ambulance.

Wednesday 15th August, meeting with Andrew Crossley (agent for the Lord of the Manor) and commoners to discuss possible re-instatement of gates to restrict unauthorised access and illegal use of the moor.

- 2. Greenbooth Car Park Turn left at the top of Woodhouse Lane Grid reference SD 86032 16158 This is greenbelt, we have permission to place the board from the Lord of the Manor, through his agent, Andrew Crossley, who we believe is the landowner
- 3. Prickshaw Broadley Fold / Station Road car park Grid reference SD 87926 16445 To replace unused wooden board please see attached photo. We believe the car park belongs to the Council
- Healey Dell Heritage Centre Grid reference SD 87931 15585 Permission is being sought from the Heritage Centre Tea Rooms and owner of Healey Hall Mill


There are two viewfinders that we wish to mount on existing Cairns in the following locations:

Gateway to Rooley Moor and the Cotton Famine Road

In the Medieval period, Rooley Moor lay within the ancient township of Spotland. In the 13th Century, a route across the moors to Whalley Abbey was established, and became Catley Lane. The first reference to buildings in the area was in 1560-61. Rooley Moor got its present name in the 18th Century when Mr Rowley, later corrupted to Rooley, settled on what was to become the site of the Old Moorcock Inn. The Cotton Famine Road came about because of the American Civil War. Scan the QR code (bottom right) for trail and historic information.


