MEETING MINUTES: The meeting commenced at 19:00

1. Introduction

The forum Chair, Andy Meek, opened the meeting, welcomed all, dealt with housekeeping (fire exit and toilets), and apologies (detailed above).

2. Meeting code of conduct

Andy asked people to note the code of conduct.

3. Conflicts of interest and conflicts of loyalty

Andy asked those present to declare any conflicts of interest or loyalty.
None were declared.

4. Approve Minutes of the 2023 AGM held Thursday, 2nd February 2024 at 7pm

Andy confirmed minutes were circulated after the AGM and no amendments were made.

- Jim Murphy proposed to accept the minutes.
- Nigel Morrell seconded the proposal.
- Unanimously accepted by everyone present at the meeting.

5. Accounts for year ending 31st August 2024

John Newcombe advised the accounts are quite simple, there have been minimal transactions from mostly ringfenced funds and it wasn't felt necessary to seek independent examination. The income of £1,194 is a grant for reinstatement of the Rooley Moor Road / Knacks Lane barrier, which was vandalized after it was re-instated. The expenditure will be shown in next year's accounts. The £414 expenditure was for the section 38 application to Secretary of State for the fencing and structures along the rural section of Edenfield Road

We agreed the reserves policy will remain unchanged at £400.

- Nigel Morrell proposed to accept the accounts and leave our reserve policy unchanged.
- Jim Murphy seconded the proposal.
- Unanimously accepted by everyone present at the meeting.

6. Legal & Administrative Information

Andy Meek explained the legal and administrative information and whilst we are not seeking an independent examiner for the accounts the detail of the accounts is available for anyone who might wish to see them.

Andy Noted that the Registered office needed to be updated in the reports pack to reflect the new address here at the Old Library.

7. Reports from Trustees and Officers

Andy Meek explained the content of the report and gave additional time for those present to review its content. Nigel Morrell provided an update on offroad initiatives with increased frequency and focus from the Police highlighting other issues like drugs driving, drink driving, untaxed vehicles, stolen vehicles, etc. This is now on radar of the Chief Superintendent and GMP now have an offroad vehicle and use of bikes. GMP are appreciative of volunteer help. Cooperation within and across the various police forces (Greater Manchester, Lancashire, and West Yorkshire) is improving. Jim Murphy mentioned survey from Sgt Walsh and encouraged everyone to fill it in. Alan Rawsterne highlighted the opportunity of Heritage Open Days and the forum invitation for new Trustees.

9. Policy Update

Alan Rawsterne advised there are no policy changes. The policy and procedure are available on our website.

10. AOB

- Ruth Howard and Sam Smithard asked for thoughts on a development they would like to undertake on land in Catley Lane Head that is on Rooley Moor Road opposite their current house. They have outgrown their current home and would like to build a new house so they can stay in the area. They have sought pre-planning advice and are talking to Jenny Whetton regarding the conservation area. Planning have advised that potential issues with Green Belt make it unlikely a planning application would be approved. There are potential issues concerning conservation area status too. The forum trustees present suggested that a recent response from RMNF to a Regulation 18 Notice Of Intention To Update Rochdale Local Plan would support limited building on Green Belt and in the conservation area if it was in keeping with the area and meant it allowed local people to remain in the area. Nigel Morrell offered to give advice outside of meeting.
- Scout Moor 2 Wind Farm: Forum doesn't have a stance at the moment and is currently trying to help both Local Planning Authorities (LPAs) formulate a correct response for a Scoping Opinion required to produce an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and an Environmental Statement (ES), we are basically pointing out things that Cubico have missed in their scoping report. The next stage will be the production of an EIA and an ES. RMNF and others are trying to raise awareness so people can be informed and can express their views to

the LPAs through the planning channels. During our discussion it became clear there is an almost complete unawareness amongst residents of the scale of this proposed development and there is a concern this is a 'done deal'. RMNF has raised concern about the policy of Rochdale BC in withholding information (in the sense of inadequate disclosure) contained within representations by refusing to post suitably redacted submissions on the Planning Portal - in contrast to Rossendale. What is absolutely clear, at this stage of the case, is that there is no support that we are aware amongst residents for a wind farm expansion on Rooley Moor and The Cotton Famine Road. The meeting participants were unanimous in the conclusion that this development as proposed will mark the permanent destruction of Rooley Moor, the Cotton Famine Road and the other heritage assets on it and at its fringe. The RMNF trustees were very clear they are NOT against appropriate green energy development but there must be a balanced consideration of the gains and losses. To us, in this case this is crystal clear. This area has contributed enough, and the size and scale of this expansion is not appropriate on Green Belt Common Land. The consensus in the room at this meeting is that RMNFs position should be to oppose the Scout Moor 2 Wind Farm development.

ACTION: The Forum members present at this AGM meeting agreed that they wish for RMNF to be against future development of the moorland in and around our neighbourhood area. We agreed to seek ratification of this proposal by asking all members of RMNF to comment.

- Cotton Famine Road Project: Alan Rawsterne explained that the Mick Martin play didn't get any funding and the project is now closed.
- CCTV Lane Head: Nigel Morrell explained that mobile CCTV has been allocated and attached to the lamppost at old bus terminus in Catley Lane Head. This is a temporary installation, and our Ward Councillors have backed a bid for permanent camera. The Township North committee are expected to ratify the proposal at their meeting in March. The Catley Lane Head residents present at this meeting advised they have noticed a big difference with a reduction in activity, especially at night and more police presence.
- Broadley Fishing Pond Repairs: The path around the fishing pond is disappearing. The council and the nature reserve warden are aware. Nigel Morrell advised he is pursuing the council to provide a fix before the pond needs draining or the pathways collapse, and the pond drains itself.
- Fund Raising: Might need to do some! We agreed for Ding Quarry Action Group (DQAG) fund to be used for lobbying against the Scout Moor 2 Wind Farm proposal. Everyone present at this meeting felt the DQAG fund restriction, "to promote and protect the area" was appropriate to the circumstances of the Scout Moor 2 Wind Farm proposal and the DQAG fund should be used for leaflets and banners, etc.

Reports from Trustees and Officers of the Forum

Structure, Governance and Management

Trustees manage the affairs of the CIO and may for that purpose exercise all the powers of the CIO. In exercising their powers and duties, charity Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charities Commission.

It is the duty of each Trustee:

- a) To exercise his or her powers and to perform his or her functions as a Trustee of the CIO in the way he or she decides in good faith would be most likely to further the purposes of the CIO; and
- b) To exercise, in the performance of those functions, such care and skill as is reasonable in the circumstances having regard in particular to:
 - i. any special knowledge or experience that he or she has or holds himself or herself out as having; and
 - ii. if he or she acts as a charity Trustee of the CIO in the course of a business or profession, to any special knowledge or experience that it is reasonable to expect of a person acting in the course of that kind of business or profession.

Members of the CIO have no liability to contribute to its assets and no personal responsibility for settling its debts and liabilities.

There are no paid employees of the CIO and the value of services provided by volunteers is not incorporated into financial reporting.

Including Trustees and Officers there are currently 42 members of the CIO with voting rights. This is one more than last year, and it is worth noting we have seen membership of the forum Facebook page grow to 1,100 members. We have also seen an increased number of people registering on the Forum website, which currently stands at 63, the majority of whom have no voting rights.

Recruitment & Appointment of Trustees

At every Annual General Meeting of the members of the CIO, one-third of the charity Trustees retire from office. If the number of charity Trustees is not three, or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to one-third shall retire from office, but if there is only one charity Trustee, he or she shall retire. The charity trustees to retire by rotation shall be those who have been longest in office since their last appointment or reappointment.

Any vacancies so arising may be filled by the decision of the members at the Annual General Meeting and the members or the charity Trustees may at any time decide to appoint a new charity Trustee, whether in place of a charity Trustee who has retired or been removed, or as an additional charity Trustee, provided that the limit of 12 charity Trustees is not exceeded.

In February this year Cecile Biant resigned as RMNF Honorary Vice President, so that she able concentrate on her other priorities. This year Andy Meek, Nigel Morrell and Alan Rawsterne will resign as Trustees at the 2025 Annual General Meeting, and they all wish to be considered for re-election.

Forum Objects

The CIO is established for the public benefit without distinction of ability, sex, sexual orientation, race or political, religious or other opinions for the following purposes in the Area of Benefit known as Rooley Moor, which shall hereinafter be referred to as the Neighbourhood.

The objects of the CIO are:

1. To promote high standards of planning and architecture in or affecting the Area of Benefit.
2. To educate the public in the geography, history, natural history, culture and architecture of the Area of Benefit.
3. To secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features or areas of historic or public interest in the Area of Benefit.

In furtherance of the above objects but not otherwise the Trustees shall have the power to establish a Neighbourhood Forum for the Area of Benefit to promote and or improve the social, economic, and environmental well-being of the area.

Accounting Policy, Income & Funds Structure

Income arises from restricted funds (grants), unrestricted donations and recovered Gift Aid.

Expenditure is recognised when an invoice is received, or payment made.

There are no tangible fixed assets.

The Reserves Policy of Rooley Moor Neighbourhood Forum CIO is to hold reserves from unrestricted funds to cover our known annual liabilities (such as insurance, hire of meeting rooms, website costs, etc.). £400 has been proposed to cover these costs. The reserves policy will be reviewed at each Annual General Meeting.

Achievements & Performance

This year's financial transactions are not significant, but we've not been dormant, and we continue to explore opportunities to help us deliver our charitable objectives.

Off road vehicles - Operation Dragster continues as a combined initiative between Greater Manchester Police, Lancashire Police, West Yorkshire Police, United Utilities, and many local volunteers. The objective of Operation Dragster to reduce the growing volume of illegal off-road activity in and around our area that is so badly damaging the moorland, attracting fly tipping and other types of antisocial behaviour, has been severely undermined by the insistence of Cubico Sustainable Investments to use Catley Lane Head and the Mary Towneley Loop National Trail Bridleway as an access route to erect a meteorological mast at Top of Leach - more of that later. Following the repair of the barrier and gate on the bridleway at the Rooley Moor Road / Knacks Lane junction, it was vandalised again a few weeks after its reinstatement and is now beyond economical repair. Unfortunately, legitimate users of the moorland remain at risk through reckless behaviour and / or threats of violence from illegal off roaders. We are grateful to all involved in Operation Dragster, although it's disappointing to note that the number of illegal motorised vehicles being reported accessing the moor seems to be increasing.

The "Norden, Bamford and Heywood Bridleways Association" (NBHBA) Section 38 application to the Secretary of State went to inquiry to seek permission and the Endenfield Road fence was approved with conditions. We believe those conditions have been implemented and the Section 38 case is completed and closed.

Moorland Restoration - Our commitment to preserving our upland moorlands from onerous development and aggressive misuse is constant, ongoing, and worthwhile. The forum trustees are disappointed to note a recent application from Cubico Sustainable Investments for the development of a wind farm that includes Rooley Moor.

Planning - The trustees resolutely support the forum's primary objective, to promote high standards of planning and architecture in or affecting the Neighbourhood Area. We remain committed to preserving the Conservation Area's, Green Belt and Common Land in and around the Neighbourhood Area, which includes the habitations and surrounding landscapes.

The trustees have carefully considered the role of local planning and how Planning Officers work with and on behalf the local communities they are tasked to serve. The forum continues to try and be actively engaged in specific areas of direct concern and monitors weekly planning applications that are lodged with the Council.

The forum trustees have submitted a response to the Regulation 18 Notice of intention to update the Rochdale Local Plan and Call for Sites.

Scout Moor II Wind Farm - The proposed Scout Moor II Wind Farm has been a major area of focus for RMNF over the past year, particularly given its potential impact on the moorland landscape, heritage assets, and the wider setting of the Cotton Famine Road and Rooley Moor.

A new planning application for the scheme is now live and has been formally submitted to both Rossendale Borough Council and Rochdale Borough Council. RMNF is monitoring both applications closely and trying to engage with each Local Planning Authority to ensure that community concerns and heritage considerations are fully represented.

The Forum's position remains opposed to any development on Scout Moor and that the applicant must robustly address:

- Noise and the unacceptable risks to health and of rendering homes uninhabitable due to Wind Turbine Acoustic Pollution (WTAP).
- The cumulative landscape and visual impact on the South Pennine uplands, including key viewpoints from Rooley Moor and the Mary Towneley Loop.
- The potential harm to the historic environment, particularly the Cotton Famine Road.
- The ecological sensitivity of the peatland habitats and the implications for carbon storage, water management, and biodiversity.
- The need for transparent and participatory decision-making processes.

Greater Manchester Clean Air Zone - The Government has formally ruled out a charging Clean Air Zone in Greater Manchester. Instead, the Greater Manchester Combined Authority will deliver an investment-led Clean Air Plan focused on cleaner buses, taxi upgrades, and traffic-flow improvements. Whilst we consider this matter to be closed, we will continue to monitor the process.

Catley Lane Head Conservation Area - We are pleased to report that a permanent CCTV installation has been provided to help reduce antisocial behaviour in the area. We continue to pursue the following initiatives:

- Reinstatement of a bus service to the village, and
- Traffic calming measures either side of the village.

Social media - We are asking organisations and the public not to advertise on our sites. However, the forum trustees are happy to allow appropriate content from “not for profit” organisations that will help people.

We continue to work with other organisations and are pleased to be members of **Macc**, a charity whose purpose is quite simply the city of Manchester. They encourage, support, and help to develop voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations to allow local people to have a real influence over the places and communities in which they live.

We also continue with our membership of the Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) and the Lancashire Local History Federation, the official co-ordinating body for local history in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

Lancashire and Greater Manchester Local Lists – Our nominations for the Cotton Famine Road and the Royal Ordinance Factory, Healey Hall have still not been processed for inclusion and we note as of December 2024 both websites are temporarily closed to the public.

We continue to make our heritage trail leaflets freely available throughout the borough so people can take exercise and enjoy the wide-open spaces of the surrounding moorland.

Cotton Famine Road Project - Our work with History in Action CIC and writer Mick Martin to commission a community arts project to meet our education object came to nothing. Unfortunately, our aim to create and undertake a community arts project was not considered a suitable application for National Lottery Heritage Funding.

Governance

Policies and Procedures – We have reviewed and maintained our Safeguarding policy and procedure.

Public Liability Insurance (PLI) - Has been renewed to allow forum meetings, activities, and events to continue.

Health & Safety - There are no issues to report.

Trustee training – There has been no training.
